END USER SOFTWARE LICENSE AGREEMENT

(EULA) FOR THE GRYPHON™ I GBT/GM4500 PRODUCT SERIES

NOTICE TO END USER: BY DOWNLOADING OR INSTALLING THE SOFTWARE, OR BY USING THE DATALOGIC PRODUCT THAT INCLUDES THIS SOFTWARE, THE END USER CONSENTS TO BE BOUND BY THIS AGREEMENT. IF THE END USER DOES NOT AGREE WITH ALL OF THE TERMS OF THIS AGREEMENT, THEN DATALOGIC IS NOT WILLING TO LICENSE THE SOFTWARE AND THE END USER IS NOT ALLOWED TO DOWNLOAD, INSTALL OR USE THE SOFTWARE OR THE DATALOGIC PRODUCT---

This End User License Agreement ("EULA") is between Datalogic IP Tech S.r.l. having its registered office at Via San Vitalino 13, 40012 Calderara di Reno (Bologna), Italy ("Datalogic"), and you, either an individual or a single entity, ("End User or "You") who has purchased one or more GRYPHON™ I GBT/GM4500 ("Datalogic Product") subject to the terms and conditions provided in any relevant purchase or sale contract. This EULA applies to the software contained in the Datalogic Product ("Embedded Software") and to any other software, to the extent applicable, offered as optional application software ("Application Software" that together with "Embedded Software" is herein referred to as "Software"). Any Open Source used in a conjunction with the Software is subject to the Open Source licenses available at the following website: <http://www.datalogic.com/oss>

1. Grant of License

- 1.1 Datalogic grants to End User, a personal, non-exclusive, non-transferable, non sub licensable, revocable, limited license to use the Software, solely on the Datalogic Product in which it is embedded or for which it is intended for use, in machine-readable form only, solely for End User's internal business purposes.
- 1.2 End Users shall not distribute, sublicense, rent, loan, lease, assign, export, re-export, resell, ship or divert or cause to be exported, re-exported, resold, shipped or diverted, directly or indirectly, the Software under this Agreement. End User shall not, and shall not permit others to: (i) modify, translate, decompile, reverse engineer, disassemble, or extract the inner workings of the Software, (ii) copy the functionality of the Datalogic Products; (iii) remove any proprietary notices, marks, labels, or logos from the Datalogic Products; (iv) rent or transfer all or some of the Software to any other party without Datalogic's prior written consent.
- 1.3 Title to the licensed Software shall be and remain with Datalogic or the third party from whom Datalogic has obtained a license right. This Agreement does not grant to End User any intellectual property rights. As used in this Agreement the term "purchase" or its equivalent when applied to the Software shall mean "acquire under license". End User is not entitled to receipt or use of the source code of any licensed Software.
- 1.4 Portions of the Datalogic Product are protected by the relevant and applicable patent and copyright laws, international treaty provisions, and other applicable laws. Therefore, End User must treat the Datalogic Product like any other copyrighted material (e.g., a book or musical recording) except that End User may make one copy of the Software solely for back-up purposes. Unauthorized duplication of the Software constitutes copyright infringement.
- 1.5 Any use of the Software outside of the conditions set forth herein is strictly prohibited and will be deemed a breach of this Agreement resulting in immediate termination of this Agreement. In the event of

a breach of this Agreement, Datalogic will be entitled to all available remedies at law or in equity (including but not limiting to immediate termination of the license without notice, immediate injunctive relief and repossession of all Datalogic Products).

- 1.6 Without prejudice of the foregoing, End User grants to Datalogic and its independent accountants or consultants the right to examine End User's books, records and accounts during End User's normal business hours to verify compliance with this Agreement. In the event such audit discloses non-compliance with this Agreement, Datalogic shall be entitled to immediately terminate the Agreement, request End User to promptly pay all (additional) license fees due and any further damages, if any.

2. License Fee

License fees shall be due by End User to Datalogic according to the terms provided for in the relevant contract for the purchase of the Datalogic Product.

3. Termination

Without prejudice to any other rights or remedies Datalogic may have, Datalogic may terminate this Agreement if End User fails to comply with the terms and conditions of this Agreement. Datalogic may terminate this Agreement by offering you a superseding Agreement for the Software or any replacement or modified version of or upgrade to the Software and conditioning your continued use of the Software or such replacement, modified or upgraded version on your acceptance of such superseding Agreement. In addition, either party may terminate this Agreement at any time. Subject to the foregoing, termination shall be effective upon notice to the other party. In the event that this Agreement terminates for any reason, End User's license to use the Software will immediately terminate, and End User must immediately stop using the Software, destroy all copies of the Software and all of its component parts, and, upon request, provide an affidavit certifying your compliance with the foregoing. The provisions of Sub-sections 1.2, 1.3, 1.4, 1.5, 4, 5, 6, 8, and 11 shall survive termination of this Agreement.

4. Limited Warranty

Datalogic warrants that, under normal use and operation, the Software will conform substantially to the applicable Datalogic Product documentation for the period specified in the same, provided that the Software is used with the Datalogic Product. Datalogic's entire liability and End User's sole and exclusive remedy for any breach of the foregoing limited warranty will be, at Datalogic's option, the provision of a downloadable patch or replacement software.

Datalogic does not warrant (i) that Software will meet End User's requirements; (ii) that Software will be uninterrupted or defect error free; (iii) any non conformity derived from unauthorized use, and/or improper installation or repair not in compliance with Datalogic Product documentation. End User agrees that the existence of such non conformities or errors and Datalogic's inability to remedy such errors shall not constitute a breach of this Agreement.

IN NO EVENT SHALL DATALOGIC'S LIABILITY FOR DAMAGES, IF ANY, WHETHER BASED UPON CONTRACT, TORT (INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE), PRODUCT LIABILITY, STRICT LIABILITY, WARRANTY, OR ANY OTHER BASIS, EXCEED THE PRICE OR FEE PAID BY END USER FOR THE DATALOGIC PRODUCT. 6. Indemnification

10. Open Source Software

Portions of the Software include or operate with Open Source software ("Open Source Software").

Open Source Software is software covered by a publicly available license governed solely under Copyright law, whereas the complete terms and obligations of such license attach to a licensee solely through the act of copying, using and/or distributing the licensed software, such obligations often include one or more of attribution obligations, distribution obligations, copyleft obligations, and intellectual property encumbrances. The use of any Open Source Software is subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement as well as the terms and conditions of the corresponding license of each Open Source Software package. If there is a conflict between the terms and conditions of this Agreement and the terms and conditions of the Open Source Software license, the applicable Open Source Software license will take precedence. Datalogic is required to reproduce the software licenses, acknowledgments and copyright notices as provided by the authors and owners, thus, all such information is provided in its native language form, without modification or translation. Please reference and review the above mentioned information to identify which Open Source Software packages have source code provided or available.

11. Notices

All notices required or authorized under this Agreement shall be given in writing, and shall be effective when received, with evidence of receipt. Notices to Datalogic shall be sent to the attention of Datalogic IP Tech S.r.l., Legal & IP Department, Via San Vitalino 13, 40012 Calderara di Reno (Bologna), Italy, or such other address as may be specified by Datalogic in writing.

12. General Provisions

- 12.1 Entire Agreement; Amendment. This document contains the entire agreement between the parties relating to use of the Datalogic Products and the licensing of the Software and supersedes all prior or contemporaneous agreements, written or oral, between the parties concerning the use of the Datalogic Products and licensing of the Software. This Agreement may not be changed, amended, or modified except by written document signed by Datalogic.
- 12.2 Waiver. A party's failure to enforce any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall not prevent the party's later enforcement of such terms and conditions.
- 12.3 Governing Law; Venue: End User agrees to the application of the laws of the country in which End User obtained the license to govern, interpret, and enforce all of End User's and Datalogic's respective rights, duties, and obligations arising from, or relating in any manner to, the subject matter of this Agreement, without regard to conflict of law principles. The United Nations Convention on Contracts for the International Sale of Goods does not apply.

All rights, duties, and obligations are subject to the courts of the country in which End User obtained the license. For licenses granted by Licensee who operates in the countries specified below, the following terms apply.

For Americas:

This Agreement is governed by the laws of the State of Oregon. This Agreement and the rights of the parties hereunder shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Oregon U.S.A, without regard to the rules governing conflicts of law. The state or federal courts of the State of Oregon located in either Multnomah or Lane counties shall have exclusive jurisdiction over all matters regarding this Agreement, except that Datalogic shall have the right, at its absolute discretion, to initiate proceedings in the courts of any other state, country, or territory in which End User resides, or in which any of End User's assets are located. In the event an action is brought to enforce the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to reasonable attorneys' fees, both at trial and on appeal.

For Europe, Middle East and Africa:

This Agreement is governed by the laws of Italy. This Agreement and the rights of the parties hereunder shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of Italy, without regard to the rules governing conflicts of law. Italian Court of Bologna shall have exclusive jurisdiction over all matters regarding this Agreement, except that Datalogic shall have the right, at its absolute discretion, to initiate proceedings in the courts of any other state, country, or territory in which End User resides, or in which any of End User's assets are located. In the event an action is brought to enforce the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to reasonable attorneys' fees, both at trial and on appeal.

For Asia- Pacific Countries:

The validity, interpretation and construction of the Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with Laws of the Republic of Singapore. Parties expressly disclaim the application of the United Nations Convention for International Sale of Goods.

Any dispute arising out of or in connection with this contract, including any question regarding its existence, validity or termination, shall be referred to and finally resolved by arbitration administered by the Singapore International Arbitration Centre ("SIAC") in accordance with the Arbitration Rules of the Singapore International Arbitration Centre ("SIAC Rules") for the time being in force, which rules are deemed to be incorporated by reference in this clause. The seat of the arbitration shall be Singapore.

The number of arbitrators will be three, with each side to the dispute being entitled to appoint one arbitrator. The two arbitrators appointed by the parties will appoint a third arbitrator who will act as chairman of the proceedings. Vacancies in the post of chairman will be filled by the president of the SIAC. Other vacancies will be filled by the respective nominating party. Proceedings will continue from the stage they were at when the vacancy occurred. If one of the parties refuses or otherwise fails to appoint an arbitrator within 30 days of the date the other party appoints its, the first appointed arbitrator will be the sole arbitrator, provided that the arbitrator was validly and properly appointed. All proceedings will be conducted, including all documents presented in such proceedings, in the English language. The English language version of these terms and conditions prevails over any other language version.

12.4 Attorneys' Fees. In the event an action is brought to enforce the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to reasonable attorneys' fees, both at trial and on appeal.

GRYPHON™ GBT/GM4500

DESCRIPTION

The Gryphon™ product series from Datalogic has been perceived as one of the most innovative readers since the beginning and the new generation of 4500 series wireless readers reinforce this concept thanks to the battery wireless charging system that, coupled with an outstanding design, unchallenged ergonomics and a rich feature set, bring the Datalogic Gryphon GM/GBT4500 series to the TOP of hand held scanners for general purpose applications.

On top of contactless recharging, the high-resolution Mega Pixel sensor for outstanding reading results coupled with Datalogic's distinctive warm-white illumination technology, the high visible red 4-dot and aimer and the Datalogic Motionix™ motion-sensing technology will represent additional key elements for the operators who will find the Gryphon GM/GBT4500 extremely easy to use and intuitive in the Retail, Manufacturing, Transportation & Logistics and Healthcare industries.

Omni-Directional Operating

To read a symbol or capture an image, simply aim the reader and pull the trigger. The Gryphon™ I GBT/GM4500 is a powerful omni-directional reader, so the orientation of the symbol is not important. Datalogic's exclusive patented 'Green Spot' for good-read feedback helps to improve productivity in noisy environments or in situations where silence is required. When positioning the product into the stand, the magnetic coupling will make the scanner automatically detect a bar code inside the field of view, and switch the reading system from trigger mode to autosense mode.

Decoding

The Gryphon™ I GBT/GM4500 reliably decodes all standard 1D (linear) and 2D bar codes, including GS1 DataBar™ linear codes, Postal Codes (China Post), Stacked Codes (such as GS1

DataBar Expanded Stacked, GS1 DataBar Stacked, GS1 DataBar, Stacked Omnidirectional). The data stream - acquired from decoding a symbol - is rapidly sent to the host. The reader is immediately available to read another symbol.

SETTING UP THE READER

Follow the steps below to connect and get your reader up and communicating with its host.

1. Configure the Base Station starting on this page.
2. Charge the Batteries (see page 11).
3. Link to the Base Station (see page 16).
4. Select the Interface Type (see page 18).
5. Configure the Reader starting on page 19 (optional, depends on settings needed)



NOTE: According to recent modification of Regulation for shipping Li-Ion based battery packs, the products and their spare battery packs parts are shipped with a very low residual charge (low state of charge).

Hence the needs:

- **that a new product must be fully recharged before starting to use it.**

and

- **that battery packs of the stocked products GBT/GM4500 and spare battery pack parts must be periodically recharged. For instance, by using a WLC4090 cradle powered up with a 12V Datalogic AC/DC adapter (cod.8-0935) for at least 30 minutes each 3 months.**

Positioning the Base Station

The base station/charger may be set up in desk application to hold the reader in two different positions, either a horizontal or vertical position, in order to provide the most comfortable use depending on the needs.

Figure 1 - Horizontal Position



This position is preferred, unless a different specific positioning is required, for its outmost ease of insertion as well as the minimum effort and attention required to customer when docking the scanner.

Figure 2 - Presentation Position



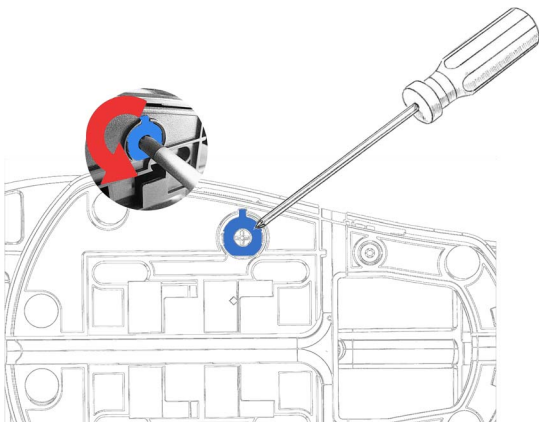
This position is preferred if the scanner is to be used in stand mode and not needed to be often removed from base station.

Figure 3 - Vertical Position



This position is preferred when lack of room on the desk-top recommends the scanner to be left vertical during recharging.

1. Insert the appropriate parts for the desired base station position.
2. Release the screw situated on the bottom of the cradle's base (the screw will be kept in position by the blue ring).



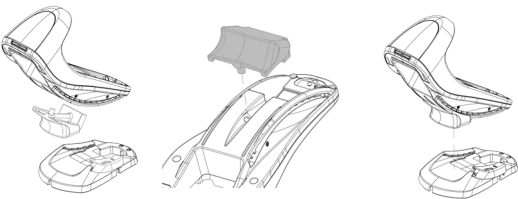
- Using your thumbs, push open the plastic tabs on the bottom of the base to free the wing holders.



- The stand can now be repositioned in either horizontal or standing position.



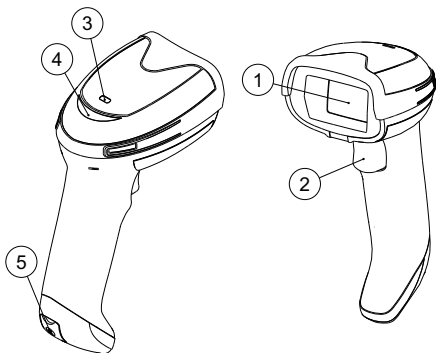
NOTE: To improve the robustness (against accidental falls) of the cradle in Presentation Position, it is suggested to add the Shock Absorber addendum as illustrated below.



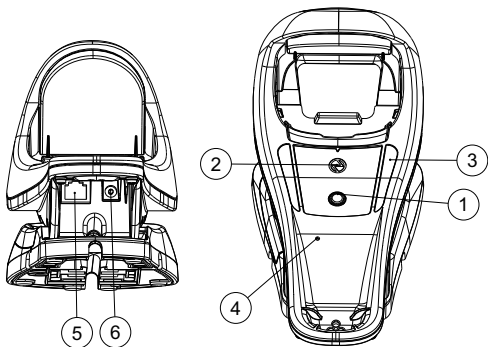
READER, CRADLE AND LEDs DESCRIPTION

LEDs on the gun provide information about the battery charging status as well as data transmission.

CONNECTING THE BASE STATION

Figure 5 shows how to connect the Base Station to a terminal, PC or other host device. Turn off the host before connection and consult the manual for that equipment (if necessary) before proceeding. Connect the interface cable before applying power to the Base Station.

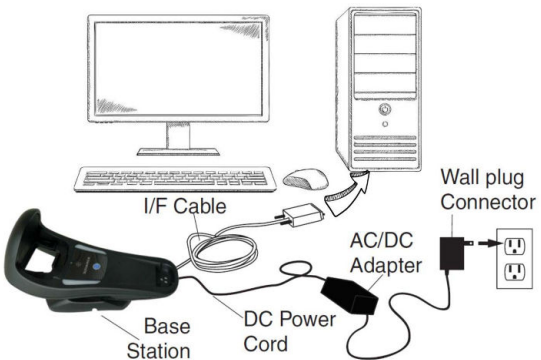


NOTE: The Gryphon GBT/GM4500 can also be Powered by the Terminal. When powered by the Terminal, the battery charger is automatically set as Slow charge.

For some specific interfaces or hosts or lengths of cable, the use of an external power supply is recommended for full recharging capability (see "Technical Specifications" on page 35 for more details).

Base Station Connection and Routing — Fully insert the Power Cable and Interface (I/F) Cable connectors into their respective ports in the underside of the Base Station. Then connect to an AC Adapter, and plug the AC power cord into the (wall) outlet.

Securing the DC Power Cord (Optional)

The DC power cord for the adapter can be secured to the bottom of the base in order to maximize the mechanical retention of the cable itself. The routing of the power cord can be changed to accommodate base station positioning: horizontal, stand or wall mount. The cables can be looped around to the front of the Base Station, or fed directly out the back of the Base Station, as shown in [Figure 6](#).

Figure 6 - Options for routing the DC cord



Host Connection — Verify before connection that the reader's cable type is compatible with your host equipment. Most connections plug directly into the host device as shown in [Figure 7](#). Keyboard Wedge interface cables have a 'Y' connection where its female end mates with the male end of the cable from the keyboard and the remaining end at the keyboard port on the terminal/PC.

Power Connection — Plug the AC Adapter into an approved AC wall socket with the cable facing downwards (as shown in [Figure 5](#)) to prevent undue strain on the socket.

Disconnecting the Cable — To detach the cable, insert a paper clip or similar object into the hole on the base, as shown.

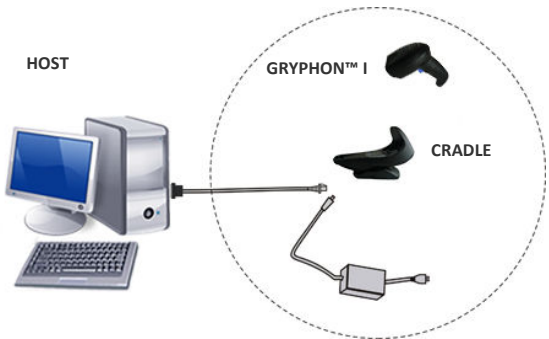
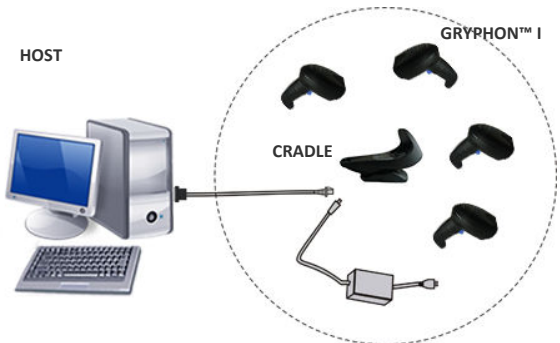
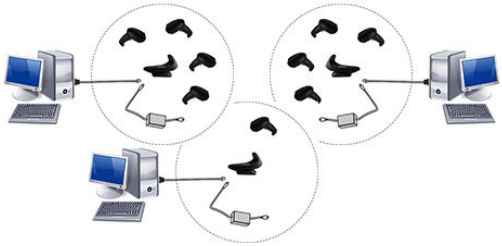


Figure 10 - Multiple Reader Layout

Many stand alone connections can operate in the same physical area without interference, provided all readers and cradles in the system have different addresses.

CHARGING THE BATTERIES

To charge the battery, simply insert the Gryphon into the base. When the scanner is fully seated in the cradle, it will sound a “chirp” to indicate that the cradle has detected the scanner connection.

The LEDs on the base (shown in Table 1 on page 12) will indicate the status of the battery.



NOTE: The Gryphon GBT/GM4500 may get warm during charging; this is normal and does not mean a malfunction.



NOTE: Before using the battery, read "Battery Safety" on page 47. Datalogic recommends annual replacement of rechargeable battery packs to ensure maximum performance.

THE GBT/GM4500 SCANNER

Scanner LEDs

Specific LEDs on the Gryphon Scanner provide information about: good reading result (3GL), battery status and charging status (with micro USB only). The Battery Status information can be easily retrieved by double-tapping with your fingers on top of the head of the scanner. 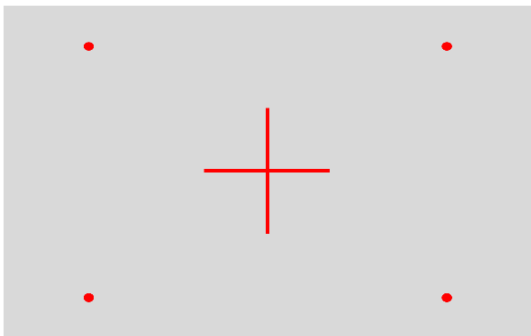

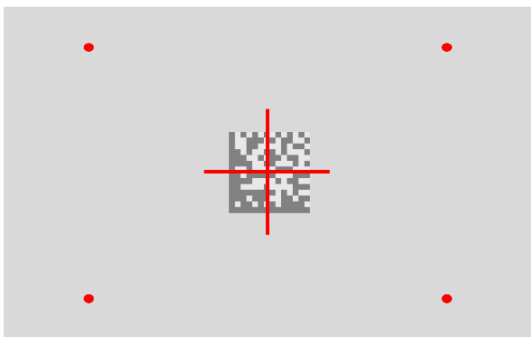
USING THE GRYPHON™ I GBT/GM4500

The Gryphon™ I GBT/GM4500 reader normally works by capturing and decoding codes. It is equipped with an internal Motionix™ motion-sensing function which activates the aiming system on device motion. The intelligent aiming system indicates the field of view which should be positioned over the bar code:

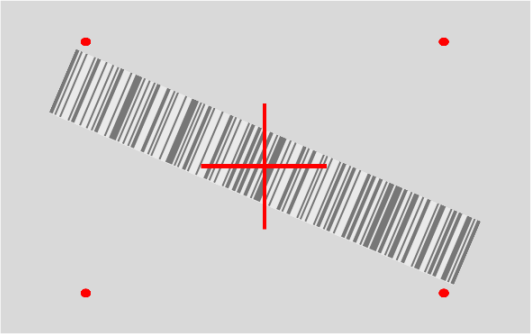
Aiming System



Relative Size and Location of Aiming Pattern



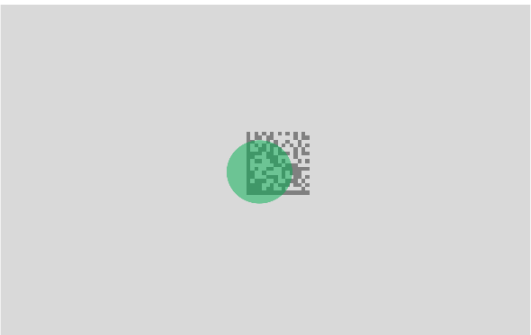

A red beam illuminates the label. The field of view indicated by the aiming system will be smaller when the reader is closer to the bar code and larger when it is farther from the code. Symbologies with smaller bars or elements (mil size) should be read closer to the unit. Symbologies with larger bars or elements (mil size) should be read farther from the unit. If the aiming system is centered and the entire bar code is within the aiming field, you will get a good read. Successful reading is signaled by an audible tone plus a good-read green spot LED indicator. Refer to the Gryphon I GD/GM/GBT 4500 Product Reference Guide (PRG) for more information about this feature and other programmable settings.

LINKING THE READER

Link Datalogic Devices to Base

Before configuring the interface, it is necessary to link the handheld with the base.

PROGRAMMING

The reader is factory-configured with a set of standard default features. After scanning the interface bar code from the Interfaces section, select other options and customize your reader through use of the programming bar codes available in the Gryphon™ I GD/GBT/GM4500 PRG. Using Programming Bar Codes

This manual contains bar codes which allow you to reconfigure your reader. Some programming bar code labels, like the "Reset Default Settings" on [page 27](#), require only the scan of that single label to enact the change.

Other bar codes require the reader to be placed in Programming Mode prior to scanning them. LED AND BEEPER INDICATIONS

The imager's beeper sounds and its illumination flashes or changes color to indicate various functions or errors on the reader. A "Green Spot" also lights to indicate a good read. The tables below list these indications. Reference the PRG for a more detailed list.

CLEANING PROCEDURE

Proper cleaning is needed on the external plastic surfaces, output window and electrical contacts to guarantee reliable scanning and charging of the battery.

A regular cleaning routine will remove the dust and dirt that may accumulate on the product over time. The maintenance activity may be repeated more frequently depending on the severity of the environment in which the scanner is used.

A periodic deeper cleaning is suggested once per month.

Cleaning plastic surfaces

Exterior surfaces and scan windows exposed to spills, smudges or debris accumulation require periodic cleaning to ensure best performance during scanning operations. Follow the procedures described in this instruction sheet to keep your Gryphon device in good operating condition.



WARNING: Be sure to turn off power and unplug the device from electrical outlet before cleaning.



CAUTION: DO NOT use abrasive pads or cleaning agents.

Cleaning enclosure and window surfaces

1. Moisten a soft cloth with a recommended cleaning solution. Be sure to apply the solution to your cloth first. Wring excessive liquid from the cloth.
2. Use the cloth to wipe down the surface of the unit. Use cotton swabs, lightly moistened, to reach in corners and crevices.
3. Use another clean dry cloth to remove any residue of the cleaning agent and ensure the unit is dry.



REPLACING THE BATTERY PACK



NOTE: Before proceeding, read "Battery Safety" on page 47. Datalogic recommends annual replacement of rechargeable battery packs to ensure maximum performance.

Use the following procedure to change the reader's battery:

1. With a narrow metallic object (i.e. a coin) or a screwdriver, unscrew the battery cover screw.



2. Extract the battery pack from its slot.



3. Insert the new battery in the same position.



4. Replace the battery holder cap, plug in the connector and return the contacts circuit to its previous location.



NOTE: When inserting the new battery into the handle, take care to position the battery and the connector as described above.

5. Insert the cover in the handle and screw it into place.



BATTERY SAFETY

To install, charge and/or perform any other action on the battery, follow the instructions in this manual.



WARNING: Do not discharge the battery using any device except for the scanner. When the battery is used in devices other than the designated product, it may damage the battery or reduce its life expectancy. If the device causes an abnormal current to flow, it may cause the battery to become hot, explode or ignite and cause serious injury. Lithium-ion battery packs may get hot, explode or ignite and cause serious injury if exposed to abusive conditions. Be sure to follow the safety warnings listed on the following page.



WARNING:

- Do not place the battery pack in fire or heat.
- Do not connect the positive terminal and negative terminal of the battery pack to each other with any metal object (such as wire).
- Do not carry or store the battery pack together with metal objects.
- Do not pierce the battery pack with nails, strike it with a hammer, step on it or otherwise subject it to strong impacts or shocks.
- Do not solder directly onto the battery pack.
- Do not expose the battery pack to liquids, or allow the battery to get wet.
- Do not apply voltages to the battery pack contacts.



WARNING: In the event the battery pack leaks and the fluid gets into your eye, do not rub the eye. Rinse well with water and immediately seek medical care. If left untreated, the battery fluid could cause damage to the eye.



WARNING: Fire or explosion hazard if battery is replaced with an incorrect model.



CAUTION: Always charge the battery at 32° – 104°F (0° – 40°C) temperature range. Use only the authorized power supplies, battery pack, chargers, and docks supplied by your DataLogic reseller. The use of any other power supplies can damage the device and void your warranty. Do not disassemble or modify the battery. The battery contains safety and protection devices, which, if damaged, may cause the battery to generate heat, explode or ignite.



CAUTION: DO NOT place the battery in or near fire, on stoves or other high temperature locations. DO NOT place the battery in direct sunlight, or use or store the battery inside cars in hot weather. Doing so may cause the battery to generate heat, explode or ignite. Using the battery in this manner may also result in a loss of performance and a shortened life expectancy.



CAUTION: DO NOT place the battery in microwave ovens, high-pressure containers or on induction cookware. Immediately discontinue use of the battery if, while using, charging or storing the battery, the battery emits an unusual smell, feels hot, changes color or shape, or appears abnormal in any other way. DO NOT replace the battery pack when the device is turned on. DO NOT remove or damage the battery pack's label. DO NOT use the battery pack if it is damaged in any part. As with other battery types, Lithium-Ion (LI) batteries will lose capacity over time. Capacity deterioration is noticeable after one year of service whether the battery is in use or not. It is difficult to precisely predict the finite life of a LI battery, but cell manufacturers rate them at 500 charge cycles. In other words, the batteries should be expected to take 500 full discharge/charge cycles before needing replacement. This number is higher if partial discharging/recharging is adhered to rather than full/deep discharging.



CAUTION: Storage of batteries for long time at fully charged status or at fully discharged status should be avoided.



CAUTION: Only in case of long storage, to avoid deep discharge of the battery it is recommended to partially recharge the battery every three months to keep the charge status at a medium level.

As a reference, run a fast recharge for 20 minutes every three months on unused products to avoid any performance deterioration of the cell.

The useful life of LI batteries depends on usage and number of charges, etc., after which they should be removed from service, especially in mission critical applications. Do not continue to use a battery showing excessive loss of capacity, it should be properly recycled / disposed of and replaced.

Collect and recycle waste batteries separately from the device to comply with European Directive 2006/66/EC, 2011/65/EU, 2002/96/EC and 2012/19/EU and subsequent modifications, US and China regulatory and other laws and regulations about the environment.
